

NEW PRESIDENT FOR DRHBA: VICTOR FIUME



Durham Region Home Builders' Association welcomes our new President, Victor Fiume, of Fiume Brothers Custom Homes Ltd.

A gala event on Nov. 15, ushered in the new President Victor Fiume, who will voluntarily serve as President of the non-profit association of companies in the building industry for a year and lead them to a more powerful voice for all of the new home buyers of Durham Region. The intimate evening was filled with live jazz music expertly performed by the Faith Amour Band, a vast amount and variety of exquisitely prepared food by Deer Creek Golf & Banquet Facility, and a broad range of fascinating guests.

Fiume is the association's 61st President, he was also their 48th President in 2002, and he has served as the Ontario Home Builders' Association President and the Canadian Home Builders' Association President. So why serve Durham Region again?

"Because everything happens at the local level," said Fiume as he addressed the 130 guests who are all in the local residential construction industry. Fiume has been working in the building industry in Durham most of his career, and he knows all too well how local factors affect the home building industry. "Everything that happens in Durham Region affects us all."

Advocacy for the home building industry, which has been heavily regulated over the years, is the key to keeping the cost of housing affordable, submitted the new President, who has already begun meeting with local politicians.

“When the average person can’t afford the average house there is a problem,” stated Fiume referring to the fact that although construction costs have only risen with inflation, government charges, taxes and fees have increased drastically, “they are now 20% of the price of a house!”

Victor Fiume thanked Jennifer Hurd for the year of service she gave to DRHBA.

In Hurd’s term \$17 million in excessive development charges were found and new home buyers were saved from paying them, as well as a number of other government fees, such as extra winter maintenance fees, that would have made the costs of homes even higher were curtailed through the work of the association.

Hurd thanked her outgoing board which consisted of Past President Emidio DiPalo, 1st VP Victor Fiume, 2nd VP Heidi Stephenson; and Directors: Danielle Bleau, Steve DeBoer, Mike DiPalo, Dave Henderson, Rick Parsons, Stephen Snider, Kevin Stewart, Marianne Tracey, Gord Wallace, Rob Wannack and Andrew Watson; as well as Presidential appointees Wayne Clarke, Drew Dowling, Joe Messina, Ken Russell and Frank MacPhee.
